Cleaning the Gutters in the Fall

Why it matters:

In Massachusetts, the fall is the most important time to clean your gutters. New England's famous fall colors bring an endless supply of leaves, pine needles, and acorns, all of which can block your system before winter arrives.

Checklist:

- Get rid of all the leaves, twigs, and other organic waste.
- Clean out the gutters well to keep downspouts from getting blocked.
- Make sure the gutters are securely fastened so they can handle the weight of the snow that is coming.
- If there are tall trees around your home, you might want to think about hiring a professional to clean it.

The best time to clean your gutters in the fall is from late October to early November, when most of the leaves have fallen but before the snow comes.

Taking care of your gutters in the winter

- Use a roof rake to safely get rid of snow that has built up on the first few feet of your roof.
- Make sure the insulation and ventilation in the attic are good. This lowers the risk of ice dams.
- Set up an inspection after the snow melts to check for damage.

How often should you clean your gutters in Massachusetts?

Massachusetts homeowners should clean their gutters at least twice a year: once in the spring and once in the fall. But if you live near big trees or in an area that gets a lot of storms, you may need to clean your gutters three to four times a year.
